MINUTES OF THE UNITED FEDERATION OF POLICE OFFICERS, INC., BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING HELD ON DECEMBER 15, 2010

This meeting was held by Tele-Conferencing the members of the Board of Directors and was advertised on the Police Federation Web Site.

Meeting opened at 5:00pm by President Ralph Purdy. Participating in the conference call were Executive Vice President Daniel Nulton and Secretary Treasurer Robert D. Gordon.

Purdy announced a quorum of the board of directors were present to conduct the meeting.

Purdy requested a motion to accept the September 30, 2010 Board of Directors meeting minutes accepted as printed without objection the motion was so ordered.

Purdy requested a motion to accept the financial report of the UFPO as printed and distributed up to November 30, 2010 without objection so ordered.

Purdy reported on his activities since the last meeting as they pertained to negotiations, grievances, and general administrative duties.

Purdy expressed a concern that was surfaced at the September meeting that there is a need to increase the dues to maintain the financial stability of the UFPO. Motion by S/T Gordon to increase the weekly dues for units participating in the Legal and Labor related program to ten (\$10.00) per week. This is the first increase in quite a few years. Without objection so ordered. Dues will be increase on January 1, 2011.

Bob Gordon reported on the ground breaking of the National Law Enforcement Museum as well as the National Law Enforcement Officers Memorial Fund. The groundbreaking although the weather was terrible was a success. The Gala was well attended nearly 1000 persons celebrated the ground breaking. Dan Nulton reported on negotiations with Town of Woodstock and Village of Walton Police contract negotiations. He further reported on 207C concerns regarding an officer in Walton PD

Purdy reported on the litigation now being handled by the Pirro law firm as it pertained to the Rockland County Narcotics Task Force Local. Two investigators were terminated over a year ago and the court has ruled against bringing the case to arbitration. He also reported on negotiations in Suffern, Haverstraw, Red Hook and Sleepy Hollow as well as a challenge by the teamsters in Ticonderoga.
